**Governing Board opinion on the in-kind contribution related to
additional activities declared by the Leaders and Core Partners of the
Clean Sky 2 programme for the period 2014-2022**

THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE CLEAN AVIATION JOINT UNDERTAKING,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EU) No 2085/2021 of 19 November 2021 establishing the Joint Undertakings under Horizon Europe (hereinafter “Single Basic Act” or “SBA”) establishing the Clean Aviation Joint Undertaking, and in particular Article 11(1)(b), 11(2), 17(2)(n), and 174(4);

Having regard to the Governing Board decision adopting the list of Governing Board decisions of the Clean Sky 2 Joint Undertaking to be transferred and continue to apply to the Clean Aviation Joint Undertaking adopted on 16 December 2021¹;

Having regard to the Governing Board decision of 22 November 2021 approving the additional activities plan 2022 for the Clean Sky 2 programme²;

Having regard to the previous Governing Board opinion on the in-kind contribution related to additional activities declared by the Leaders and Core Partners of the Clean Sky 2 Joint programme for the period 2014-2021 of 24 June 2022³;

WHEREAS:

- (1) The Governing Board has received the declaration of the value of the in-kind contributions related to Additional Activities from the Leaders and Core Partners ('private members') of Clean Sky 2 programme and their affiliated entities through the attached Annex I: Additional Activities Report 2014 – 2022.
- (2) Annex I is substantiated by the certificates for the value of in-kind contributions related to Additional Activities received by the 25 May 2023 for the years 2014 - 2022;
- (3) A detailed split-up of the total into individual amounts per member including a description of the technical content has been provided showing the link of the activities to the objectives of the Clean Sky Joint Technology Initiative;
- (4) Individual declarations of in-kind contributions related to Additional Activities of Clean Sky 2 programme private members have been compiled and reviewed by the JU Programme Office in order to confirm that the declaration for years 2014-2022 in Annex I encompasses additional activities outside the work plan and that they contribute to the objectives of the Clean Sky Joint Technology Initiative;

- (5) The values of the declared additional activities have been certified by independent external auditors appointed by the members and determined according to the usual accounting methods of the private members;

HAS ADOPTED THE FOLLOWING OPINION:

Article 1

The costs of additional activities in Annex I have been declared and certified in line with article 11(2) of the SBA;

These costs concern activities included in the additional activities plan, as approved by the Governing Board on 22 November 2021⁴, in terms of technical content and for the values certified. As such, these in-kind contributions to additional activities are contributing to the commitment made by the Leaders in the *Declaration by Industry to Clean Sky JU on Additional Activities*⁵.

The observations mentioned in Article 2 do not affect the above conclusion.

Article 2

The Governing Board takes note of the costs related to the additional activities that have already been carried out.

The Governing Board takes note that the private members' contribution to additional activities represents 126% of the minimum target set in Council Regulation No 558/2014 for the Clean Sky 2 Joint Undertaking.

The Governing Board notes that the private members' contribution to additional activities will need to exceed the minimum target as set by the Regulation and reach 127% as to make up for the gap in kind contributions from operational activities.

It underlines the importance of the private members' contribution to the objectives of the Clean Aviation Joint Undertaking and recommends to those members who are in a position to bring relevant in-kind contributions to additional activities to do so within the next reporting and certification periods.
